Conservation background

The Cranberry Meadow Pond conservation easement was donated to the Monadnock Conservancy in 2007 as part of a conservation residential subdivision, with the intention of providing a public hiking trail. Working with local partners, the Conservancy established this trail to connect downtown Peterborough to Pack Monadnock's summit.

The trail also highlights the Fernald conservation easement, held by the Town of Peterborough, and the Kane conservation easement, held by the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests.

This trail was made possible through the generosity of many private landowners along the corridor and with the help of local forester Swift Corwin, the Peterborough Recreation Department, and the Peterborough Conservation Commission.

Directions to Old Street Road Trailhead

From Keene, follow Route 101 east to Peterborough, continuing uphill past the intersection with Route 202. Approximately 1 mile past Route 202, turn left at the blinking traffic light onto Old Street Road. The trailhead is 0.2 miles ahead on the right. Parking is available along the roadside. .

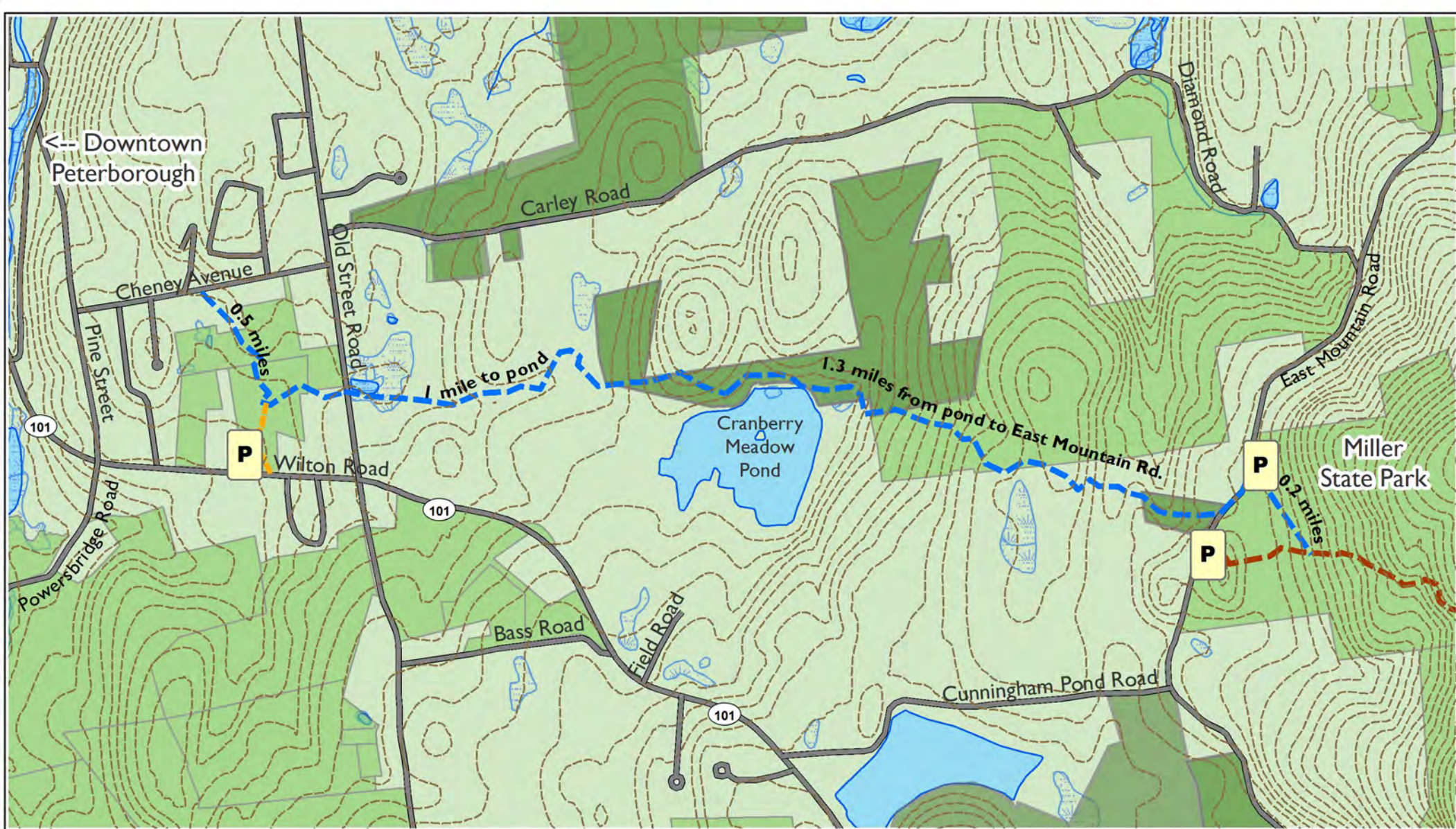
POINT-TO-POINT TRAIL

Rating: Moderately difficult
Distance/Time: 3 miles from Cheney Ave. to East Mountain Rd.
Parking/Access: Downtown or off Cheney Ave., Old Street Rd., or East Mountain Rd.

This winding trail leads you out of downtown Peterborough, N.H., through fields into hemlock forests, across a wetland boardwalk and along a winding brook up to Cranberry Meadow Pond. The trail then climbs to the top of Oak Hill before it travels east to the Raymond Trail and Pack Monadnock.

This trail crosses privately owned land and is cared for by the Monadnock Conservancy.
