



Conservation Background

The Cranberry Meadow Pond easement was donated to the Monadnock Conservancy in 2007, as part of a conservation residential subdivision, with the intention of providing a trail corridor open to the public for hiking. With local partners, the Conservancy has established this through trail to connect downtown Peterborough to Pack Monadnock Mountain.

The trail also highlights the Fernald conservation easement held by the Town of Peterborough, and the Kane conservation easement held by the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests.

This trail was made possible through the generosity of many private landowners along the corridor, and the help of several individuals in the community including local forester Swift Corwin, the Peterborough Recreation Department, and the Peterborough Conservation Commission.

Uses

This trail is open to hiking but not to wheeled vehicles. Park downtown or at the East Mountain Road parking area. Please leave only footprints.

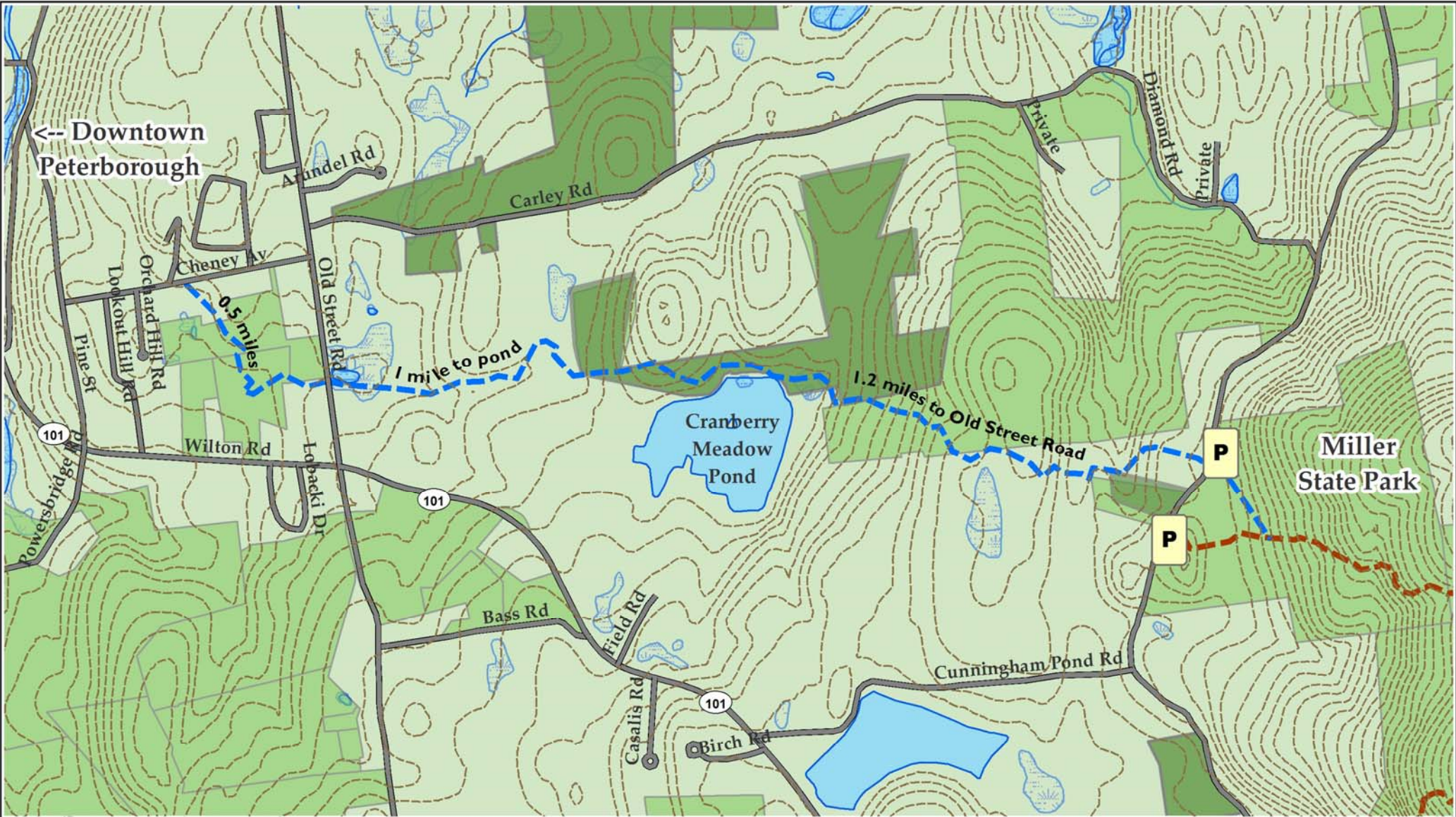
Cranberry Meadow Pond Trail PETERBOROUGH



POINT-TO-POINT TRAIL

Rating: Moderately Difficult
Distance/Time: 4.5 miles/1.5 hours
Parking/Access: Downtown or off
Cheney Ave or East Mountain Road

This winding trail leads you out of Peterborough village through fields into hemlock forests, across a wetland boardwalk, along a winding brook up to Cranberry Meadow Pond. The trail then climbs to the top of Oak Hill, and then travels east to the Raymond Trail and Pack Monadnock.
