Conservation background

The Cranberry Meadow Pond easement was donated to the Monadnock Conservancy in 2007, as part of a conservation residential subdivision, with the intention of providing a trail corridor open to the public for hiking. Working with local partners, the Conservancy established this trail to connect downtown Peterborough to Pack Monadnock’s summit.

The trail also highlights the Fernald conservation easement held by the Town of Peterborough and the Kane conservation easement held by the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests.

This trail was made possible through the generosity of many private landowners along the corridor and the help of local forester Swift Corwin, the Peterborough Recreation Department and the Peterborough Conservation Commission.

Directions

To the East Mountain Road parking area: from the intersection of state Route 101 and state Route 202 in Peterborough, follow state Route 101 2.2 miles. Turn left onto Cunningham Pond Road. Continue about 1.3 miles. At the T-intersection, turn left onto East Mountain Road and continue 0.4 miles. The parking area is on the right.

POINT-TO-POINT TRAIL

Rating: Moderately difficult

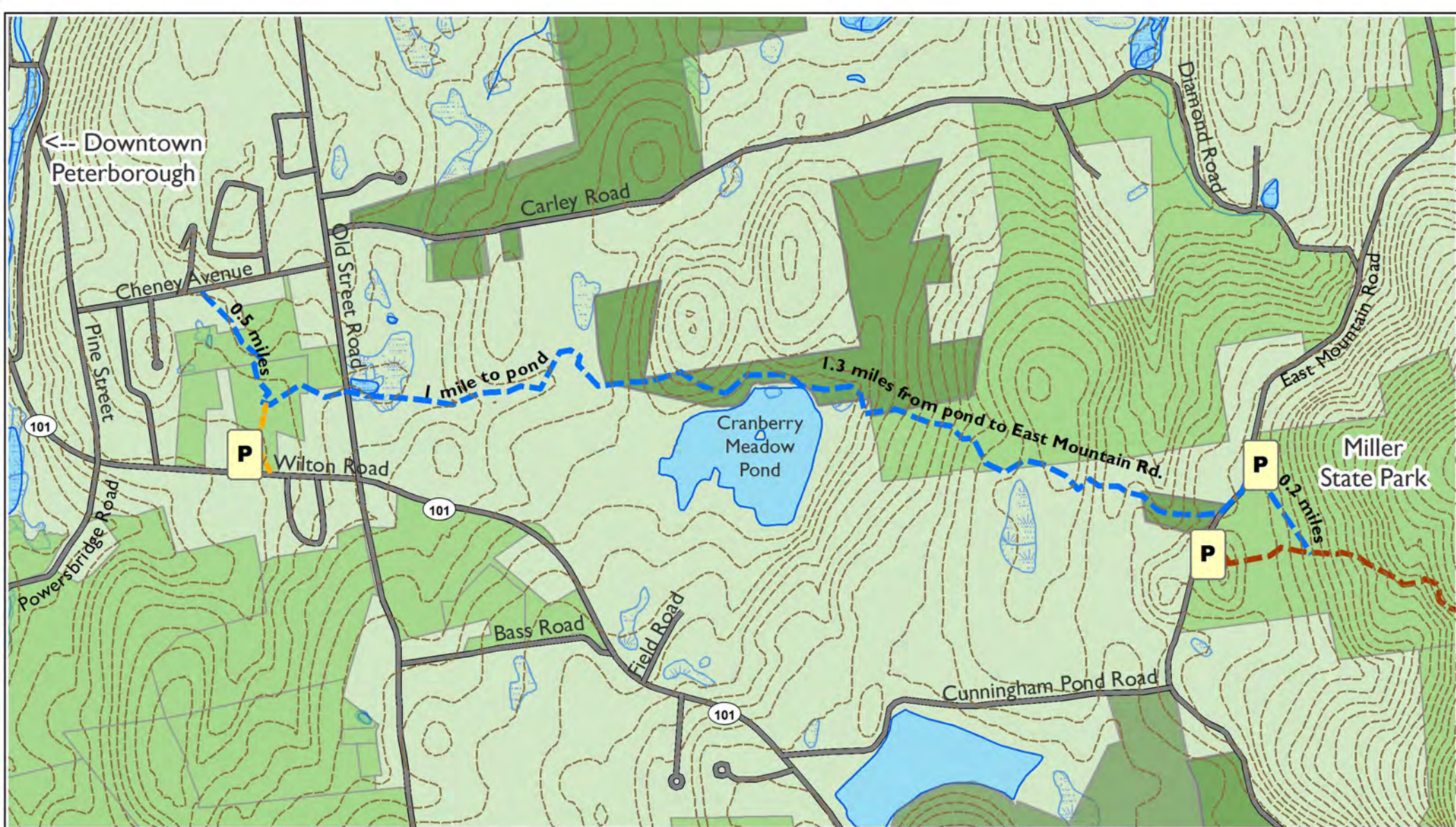
Distance/Time: 4.5 miles/1.5 hours

Parking/Access: Downtown or off Cheney Avenue or East Mountain Road

This winding trail leads you out of downtown Peterborough, N.H., through fields into hemlock forests, across a wetland boardwalk and along a winding brook up to Cranberry Meadow Pond. The trail then climbs to the top of Oak Hill, before it travels east to the Raymond Trail and Pack Monadnock.

This trail crosses privately owned land and is cared for by the Monadnock Conservancy.
